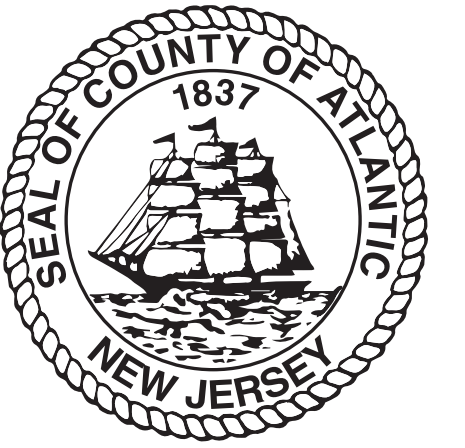

**INSTRUCTIONS FOR VOTING**

- Press the button  to the right of each candidate of your choice. A green "X" will appear next to your selection.
- To change a selection, press the button  again. The green "X" will disappear and you may make a new selection.
- If you wish to cast a write-in vote, go to the **PERSONAL CHOICE** column on the same line as the office for which you are casting the write-in vote, then:
  - Press the button  under the **PERSONAL CHOICE** column across from the office you wish to write-in. A blinking green "X" will appear.
  - Using the alphabetical keyboard below, enter the name of the person of your choice, one letter at a time.
  - To make a space between names or initials, use the arrow pointing to the right on the keyboard.
  - To make a correction, use the arrow pointing to the left.
  - The name you enter will appear in the display to the left of the keyboard.
  - When you have entered the whole name, proof it, then press the **ENTER** button on the keyboard. Your choice is recorded and removed from the display.
  - Do not press the Cast Vote Button until all other choices are completed.

**WARNING!** An improperly cast write-in vote will be deemed void. Be sure that your write-in vote is cast in the **PERSONAL CHOICE** column on the same line as the office for which you are casting the write-in vote.

- To vote in the **PUBLIC QUESTION COLUMN**, press the button  to the right of the word "YES" or "NO"; and a green "X" will appear next to your selection.
- After **ALL** selections have been made, press the **RED CAST VOTE BUTTON** located in the lower right corner. This electronically records all your votes.
- Part the curtains and exit the voting booth.

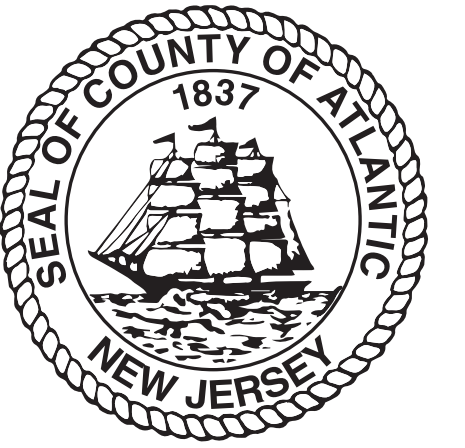
